At least since the 1990s, feminist scholars have begun to engage the field of Security Studies, joining other critical scholars in questioning long-standing assumptions of the field. This work, notable for its emphasis on global and individual (rather than national) security, draws on a long tradition of feminist engagements with issues of violence, war and peace. Since the 2000s, alongside the passing of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 which for the first time put gender issues on the agenda at the highest forum of the global community, there has been a veritable explosion of feminist work on security, leading to the establishment of the field of Feminist Security Studies. In this presentation, I will highlight some of the key interventions that feminist scholars have made in the field of Security Studies and give an overview of some of the insights their efforts have yielded. I will conclude with some reflections on the current state of the field and possible areas for future research.
