Writing Kavod

In 1992 the Israeli state chose *Kavod* (כבוד), not equality, as its key value. The Hebrew term, claims Orit Kamir (2004), encompass four related, complementing and contradicting concepts: *dignity, honor, respect* and *glory*. As individuals engaged with questions of gender and conflict resolution in a reality largely framed by perspective of *honor*, we often struggle with the psychological, economic, and socio-cultural consequences of this perception, as well as with the challenges to maintain and promote a reality based on values of *glory, dignity* and *respect*.

The *Writing Kavod*, workshop focuses on texts written around and following the second meeting of the Sophie Davis Learning Community on *Kavod*, Gender, and Conflict Resolution. The texts reflect how aspects of *dignity, honor, respect* and *glory* meet and intersect in the authors' research, activism, and lived experiences.
